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Crimson Ridge HOA Letter from the President - 2024

Dear Crimson Ridge HOA Member,

Instead of the usual chit-chat about happy holidays and where the year went, I'm just going to get right to it. 2023 was a good year for the HOA:

- Self-management continues to provide transparency into our financials enabling some costs to be understood and reduced. Reducing costs helps offset rising costs of services for 2024, keeping the dues at the current level of \$550 for 2024. The board believes that we will need to increase the dues in the following year.
- The pool coping and tile replacement was completed this fall and it cost less than anticipated, leaving our reserves in better condition. It looks great, is solid, and is safe. Great to have this done.
- Major tree trimming along 47th street and at the pool was completed this year. It is anticipated that more tree work including re-planting will be necessary in 2024.
- Started an initiative to make some updates on the declarations to allow solar panels, control rental properties, regulate trash cans, and enable preemptive steps for outdoor recreational equipment approval.

Let me expand on the last bullet point on the declaration initiative.

Members who did fill out the survey were largely supportive of the changes (75% for the changes, 25% against). Roughly 40% of our members did not fill out the survey, which was disappointing. The lack of participation is what drove this effort to fall short. During the process, some of our members provided useful and candid feedback which was appreciated. The declaration changes might be revisited in 2024 implementing the learnings from the 2023 effort. The consistent feedback was that communication of these declaration changes and call to member action was apparent, well-known, and "hard to miss." The board hopes that all members will participate if the effort is revisited. Remember, this is your HOA.

Finally, each January, the board holds an annual meeting for our members. At this meeting our members can get updates, exchange ideas, ask questions, and nominate and elect the board of directors that represent our neighborhood for the next year. If you would like to serve on the board and make a difference in guiding our neighborhood for the future, please nominate yourself (or others). Anyone can be a board member and no experience is necessary. The invitation to the meeting is included with this letter. Hope to see everyone there.

seniors.



Suburban Wildlife Beauty Surrounds Crimson Ridge



Our area sees a diverse group of non-predatory birds, animals and reptiles such as robins, cardinals, blue jays, finches, racoons, turtles, opossums, deer squirrels, rabbits, skinks, garden snakes, and many more.



We also see a number of predatory animals and while beautiful, we should be vigilant with pets and small children. Most wildlife avoid humans but some may approach or attack small wildlife and pets. Some of the most common in our area include:

Coyotes



PARKING

Coyotes are generally active at night and early morning. Their diet consists of rodents, rabbits, fruits and berries. Coyotes may sometimes seem domestic but they have also been known to attack cats and small dogs.

Bobcats



Bobcats are native to this area. They commonly hunt for rabbits, squirrel and small deer. Bobcats will also attack cats, dogs and poultry. These animals have the ability to leap fences and may shelter under decks.

Owls



There are several owl species located in Kansas. The Eastern Screech, American Barn, Barred and Great Horned Owls are few of the most common in our area. Owls are superb at pest control, eating gophers, mice, rats and moles.

Hawks, Eagles & Falcons



Also great at pest control, some of the larger birds may attempt to capture smaller animals.
