Spring and Summer Weather Safety



The beautiful state of Kansas experiences a wide variety of Spring and Summer severe weather events including various sized hail, flash flooding, damaging winds, microbursts and tornadoes.

The National Weather Service offers some great tips on how to prepare for severe weather and keep you, your family and pets safe. For more details, check out the NWS website. https://www.weather.gov/top/swaw

Some quick tips:

Be Weather Ready: Stay up-to-date on weather forecasts. Listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay informed about severe weather watches and warnings.

Severe Weather Notifications: In addition to radio or news warnings, you can activate weather alerts on your smart phone/device. In the event of a tornado, Shawnee also utilizes tornado sirens.

Have A Plan: Develop a family plan to include an emergency meeting place, such as a basement, storm cellar, or an interior room on the lowest floor with no windows. For more ideas, review additional plan information at https://www.ready.gov/make-a-plan

Practice: Administer severe weather drills (just like fire drills). Make certain to include your family pets in the drill. Some pets like to hide in poor weather so try to keep them in an easily identifiable location if severe weather is imminent.

Prepare Your Home: If severe weather is forecasted, take steps to prepare your home so you and your family can move to safety quickly.

- Home windows and doors as well as vehicles should be locked and secure.
- Outdoor furniture, grills, trampolines, etc. should be secured.
- Have personal belonging (i.e. laptops, cell phones, valuables, etc.) packed and gathered for a quick grab.
- Shoes on or easily picked up on the way to your safe space.
- Have leashes or travel crates ready for your pets.
- Store water, flash lights or lanterns, a weather radio and candles/matches in your safe space.

Community Awareness: Encourage your neighbors, extended family and friends to prepare for the possibility of severe weather. Take First Aid and/or CPR training classes or post a neighborhood list of who is FA or CPR certified. In the event of a severe storm, check on your neighbors when it's safe to do so.

Are Your Gutters Talking to You?

Gutters are installed to protect your home but when they are clogged or fall into disrepair, they can't do their job.

Rusted or clogged gutters can lead to leaky roofs, water damage and possibly foundation issues.
Additionally, clogged gutters can attract rodents, pests or mold which is probably not the type of visitors you want.

Gutter cleaning and maintenance is recommended one to four times per year, depending on the type of foliage surrounding your home.

Your foundation is safer from erosion when gutters catch water and smoothly deposit it into the downspout, directing the water flow away from your home.

Your garden and landscaping is improved by gutter maintenance as well. A well maintained gutter system needs to drain the water away from the property. When water runoff floods the landscape, it can cause plants to die and soil to erode.



When your gutters are clogged, there's nowhere for water to go. This can force water to your roof, resulting in water leaks. Leaks can lead to further damage to your home's interior, rot away your roofing system, and result in high repair costs.



Clogged gutters will begin to hold water. Between the mounting water and the weight of the debris, gutters will become incredibly heavy. This can lead to the gutter breaking away from the fascia causing damage to this portion of the roofing system.

Neglecting to maintain gutters could literally cause a home to fall apart.

Spring time brings many people outdoors. Lawn mowers come out of hibernation, garden cleaning and home projects are ramping up.

Any home exterior modifications (including but not limited to roofing, paint, siding, building additions, fencing) or equipment installations (including but not limited to swing sets, basketball goals) must have an approved Architectural Change Request (ACR) prior to construction or work start.



Please allow for up to 10 business days for standard request responses. A nonstandard request may require longer (this may include non-standard paint colors, additions, etc.).

To submit an ACR, visit payhoa.com, click requests and ACR Request Form – New Submission.

The Architectural Control Committee has not and does not express any opinion regarding the strength, engineering design or safety of said construction project. If a building permit is required, it must be obtained from your city of residence and submitted.
