Be Prepared: Spring and Summer Weather Safety

The Midwest experiences a wide variety of Spring and Summer severe weather events including various sized hail, flash flooding, damaging winds, microbursts and tornadoes.

The National Weather Service offers great tips on how to prepare for severe weather and keep you, your family and pets safe. For more details, check out the NWS website. https://www.weather.gov/top/swaw

Some quick tips:

Be Weather Ready: Stay up-to-date on weather forecasts. Listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay informed about severe weather watches and warnings.

Severe Weather Notifications: In addition to radio or news warnings, you can activate weather alerts on your smart phone/device. In the event of a tornado, Shawnee also utilizes tornado sirens.

Have A Plan: Develop a family plan to include an emergency meeting place, such as a basement, storm cellar, or an interior room on the lowest floor with no windows. For more ideas, review additional plan information at https://www.ready.gov/make-a-plan

Practice: Administer severe weather drills (just like fire drills). Make certain to include your family pets in the drill. Some pets like to hide in poor weather so try to keep them in an easily identifiable location if severe weather is imminent.



Prepare Your Home: If severe weather is forecasted, take steps to prepare your home so you and your family can move to safety quickly.

- Home windows and doors as well as vehicles should be locked and secure.
- Secure outdoor furniture, grills, trampolines, etc.
- Gather and pack personal belonging (i.e. laptops, cell phones, valuables, etc.) for a quick grab.
- Shoes on or easily picked up on the way to your safe space.
- Have leashes or travel crates ready for your pets.
- Store water, flash lights or lanterns, a weather radio, replacement batteries and candles/matches in your safe space.

Community Awareness: Encourage your neighbors, extended family and friends to prepare for the possibility of severe weather. Take First Aid and/or CPR training classes or post a neighborhood list of who is FA or CPR certified. In the event of a severe storm, check on your neighbors when it's safe to do so.

Crimson Ridge is a vibrant and bustling community, with neighbors frequently walking, running, biking, gardening, and enjoying outdoor games. Given the consistent activity and the flow of visitors and vendors, it's important to prioritize the safety and security of our homes and neighborhood.

Here are some tips for keeping your home and community safer.

Home Safety

Always secure doors and windows, especially when your home is unattended. Verify that your garage door is closed, ensure outdoor areas are well-lit, and keep valuables out of sight. Regularly inspect and replace batteries in smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors for safety.

Street Lights

Well-lit sidewalks and streets are important for keeping areas safe. If you notice a damaged or nonfunctioning street light, please report it via the City of Shawnee's online service request system

(https://www.cityofshawnee. org/residents/citizen_servic e_requests), or call the Public Works Department at (913) 742-6008.

Bike Safety

Always wear a well-fitted helmet, ride in the direction of traffic, and stay alert to your surroundings. Teach children hand signals, traffic rules, and the importance of avoiding nighttime or unsafe areas while riding.

SAFETY FIRST

Neighborhood Driving Safety

Always adhere to speed limits, yield to pedestrians, maintain a safe following distance, and stay focused by avoiding distractions such as phone use. Be vigilant around school bus stops, as drivers are required to stop when the bus stop sign is extended. With young, inexperienced drivers in our area, it's essential to educate them about the importance of pedestrian safety.

Dog Walking Safety

To ensure a safe walk with your pet, always keep your dog leashed and possibly muzzled (if needed), be aware of traffic and other hazards, and consider the weather conditions. Hot pavement can harm your dog's paw pads.
