Trash, Recycling & Yard Waste

Trash and recycling are picked up each week on Friday. Bins should be placed on the curb by 6am the morning of collection.

Trash is negotiated by the HOA board and included in the annual dues. Thus, you do not need to set up a separate account. A recycling bin (yellow lid) and a trash bin (black lid) are provided by the trash company. If you do not have a bin please contact the board and we can reach out on your behalf.

Trash needs to be in bags in the trash bin. Trash haulers will only pick up what fits in the bin. Additional trash carts may be rented individually by the resident for \$10.00 per cart per month. Recyclables must be placed in the cart loose. NO Bagging. Please only put out the approved recycling items listed below in your recycling bin. Recycling items, including glass, can also be taken to the Johnson County recycling center behind the Fire Station on 119th and Hardy.

There are a few observed holidays that cause trash collection to be delayed a day. In these instances, our trash day will move to Saturday the week of the holiday. If the holiday falls on the weekend there will be no impact to service.

NEW YEAR'S DAY - January 1, 2026 – pickup will be delayed by one day and picked up on 1/3.

MEMORIAL DAY - May 25, 2026 – pickup will be delayed by one day and picked up on 5/30.

LABOR DAY - September 7, 2026 - pickup will be delayed by one day and picked up on 9/12.

THANKSGIVING DAY - November 26, 2026 – pickup will be delayed by one day and picked up on 11/28.

CHRISTMAS DAY - December 25, 2026 – pickup will be delayed by one day and picked up on 12/26.

NEW YEAR'S DAY - January 1, 2027 – pickup will be delayed by one day and picked up on 1/2/27.

Yard waste is picked up on the same days as trash/recycling. Yard waste must be contained in compostable bags marked yard waste. If you have branches or limbs, they must be bundled and tied with twine, in 4'0" lengths or less and no more than 18" in diameter.

Railroad ties, landscape timbers, treated wood or remodeling debris are not accepted.

Each household is allowed a maximum of ten (10) bags or bundles per pick up. Pickups are weekly all year except for the period between the 2nd week of January through February when pickups are made on-call from individual residents. Pickup can be requested by calling 800-964-8988

Neighborhood Fiscal Year & HOA Dues

Indian Creek Estates Fiscal Calendar year runs from May through April each year. HOA dues (\$365.00 as of 2026) are due in May. Invoices will be mailed each April for the amount due. If the HOA dues are not paid in full by June 1st, your trash will be suspended until the balance has been paid in full.

HOA dues are currently used for neighborhood trash pickup, entrance and island landscaping as well as common area tree trimming. Several neighborhood activities and events take place throughout the year as well.

Neighborhood Communication

While some correspondence is mailed to residents, we encourage everyone to utilize eNeighbors to receive communication and connect with neighbors. Contact information for the board, forms for improvement requests, neighborhood documents and events are all posted to eNeighbors.
